## DID YOU KNOW...?

- Human Trafficking is a \$32 billion global industry.
- Human trafficking is often associated with large sporting events like the Super Bowl.
- Human trafficking is quadrupled in Michigan during the North American International Auto Show.
- Raising human trafficking awareness is not a one time, one event cause. Promoting human trafficking awareness allows for widespread community attentiveness to the issue.
- Local Detroit Pastors have joined forces with "SOAP Up Detroit" to educate hotels and motels near Cobo Hall to recognize the signs of trafficking. They also pass out thousands of bars of soap labeled with the National Human Trafficking Hotline number.
- About 76% of transactions for sex with underage girls start on the Internet.
- Forty percent of human trafficking cases involve sexual exploitation of a child.
- Human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery.
