President's Commission on the Status of Women Committees

The **Gender and Equity Committee** examines and addresses issues related to the current status of gender and equity in the campus community. It also conducts programs for the university community aimed at reaching the goals of gender equity and equality on campus.

The **Career Development Committee** concerns itself with developing and presenting programs that enhance women's career advancement. Its projects include development of a mentoring program for employees and a project to determine women's employment concerns.

The **Health Sciences Committee** provides education and support pertaining to physical and mental health issues affecting women both within the campus community and beyond.

The **Information/Research Committee** disseminates information pertaining to Commission programs, activities, and sponsorships throughout the academic community. It is also responsible for the maintenance of the Commission's Web site, and may, on occasion conduct surveys and research.

The **Outreach Committee** brings issues of concern to women to the attention of the University community. Its projects include campus-wide presentations, sponsorship of presentations by scholars on issues of concern to women, and coordination of events featuring women leaders external to the University.
