The mission of the Wayne County Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner's Advocacy Program (WC SAFE) is to provide comprehensive and compassionate medical-forensic care to Wayne County survivors of sexual assault in a timely manner with immediate crisis advocacy, follow-up care & counseling, and provision of expert witness testimony. By providing choices of these services in a confidential, non-judgmental atmosphere, with specially trained staff and at no cost to the patient – we focus on re-empowering our survivors in order to begin the healing process, and in addition, work to end Sexual Assault in our community.



You are NOT alone!

Approximately 1 in 6 women and 1 in 33 men will be a victim of sexual assault in their lifetime (RAINN). Coping with the experience of sexual assault can be difficult. The Counseling and Advocacy staff of Wayne County SAFE is available to you. We offer a safe and confidential place to talk about your feelings and provide support through your healing process as well as support to your family.

We have 3 clinic sites to serve you. Providing medical-forensic examinations in a timely manner is important for the physical health of sexual assault victims.

WC SAFE Advocacy Program

Crisis Intervention

Counselors will provide support services in– person at our clinic sites. The counseling staff is available to answer questions you may have during and following your medical exam to offer ongoing support. They will also be able to provide you with referrals for any additional needs.

Counseling

Counseling services are available to you FREE of charge through WC SAFE. Your counselor may be reached between the hours of 9am-5pm to assist you and answer any questions you may have about your medical, legal, and emotional needs. Individual and group counseling is available for survivors of sexual assault to offer support and long term treatment for abuse. You will need to contact us to set up an appointment for counseling or to receive more information about group offerings.
